MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION OF FUND PERFORMANCE

Investment Objectives and Strategies

The fundamental objective of the Sun Life Sentry Value Class (the "Fund") is to seek long-term capital appreciation through exposure to primarily equity securities of Canadian and U.S. companies by investing primarily in units of Sun Life Sentry Value Fund or its successor fund (the "underlying Trust Fund").

The underlying Trust Fund's sub-advisor (the "sub-advisor") is Sentry Investments Inc. In pursuing the underlying Trust Fund's investment objectives, the sub-advisor invests primarily in the equity securities of Canadian and U.S. companies that are considered to be undervalued compared to their perceived worth. The underlying Trust Fund may invest in debt or other fixed income instruments and may invest in U.S. and other foreign securities in an amount not exceeding 49% of the assets of the underlying Trust Fund. The underlying Trust Fund may also invest, in aggregate, up to 10% of the underlying Trust Fund's net asset value in exchange-traded funds.

Risk

There were no changes in the Fund's investment objective or strategy during the period which materially impacted the overall level of risk in the Fund. The risks associated with investing in the Fund remain as outlined in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus.

Results of Operations

During the period, the net asset value of the Fund increased from \$10.4 million to \$18.8 million. The increase in net asset value was due to positive net sales, as well as positive performance during the period.

During the period, the Fund returned 11.0% for Series A shares. This result lagged the Fund's benchmark, the S&P/TSX Composite Index, which returned 21.1%. The performance returns for other series of this Fund are similar to those of Series A except for differences in expense structures. Please refer to the 'Past Performance' section of this report for performance of each series.

The following commentary relates to the underlying Trust Fund.

Underperformance by the underlying Trust Fund relative to the benchmark was generally associated with the underlying Trust Fund's allocation to U.S. equities and the underlying Trust Fund's underweight position in the Financials and Materials sectors. During the period, the underlying Trust Fund held an average allocation of 25.1% to U.S. equities, which detracted from relative performance despite contributing to the underlying Trust Fund's absolute return. The Financials sector represented 35.0% of the benchmark at the end of the period. In contrast, the underlying Trust Fund held 2.6% in Financials at period end, which detracted from relative performance as Financials was one of the strongest performing sectors for the index during the period. The underlying Trust Fund's underweight exposure to Materials also detracted from relative performance as the sector was the top-performing sector for the index during the year.

The sub-advisor evaluates the underlying Trust Fund's investments on a stock-by-stock level. As a result, sector weights or shifts are not necessarily indicative of a particular opinion (or change of opinion) on that sector, and sector weights are merely the result of security selection. The largest shift in sector exposure was in the Real Estate sector, with a weight of 11.1% at the end of the period, up from 2.6%. This can be generally attributed to the sub-advisor taking advantage of attractive entry points to initiate positions in the sector. Another notable change in sector weight during the period was a decrease in exposure to the Consumer Discretionary sector from 18.8% to 13.0%. This can be generally attributed to the sub-advisor exiting several positions in the sector in favour of other opportunities. The cash weighting in the underlying Trust Fund remained fairly stable, ending the period at 12.0%, down from 12.2%.

Recent Developments

The Canadian equity market, as measured by the S&P/TSX Composite Index (the "TSX"), gained 21.1% during the period, led primarily by Energy, Materials and Financials. Oil prices bounced back and strengthened during the period after a tumultuous 2015. The strength in oil prices helped alleviate pressure on energy companies and resulted in strong gains within the Energy sector. Various factors contributed to reduced global oil supply during the period including intense

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forest fires in Alberta that adversely impacted production, a decrease in U.S. shale oil production, and the announcement of the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (“OPEC”) decision to reduce oil supply. Materials had a very strong period as mining companies with safe-haven assets, such as precious metals, performed well, benefitting from global uncertainty which was largely sparked by Britain’s unexpected referendum result to leave the European Union. Another market leader during the period was the Financials sector, and in particular diversified banks. Bank earnings exhibited solid growth led by their capital markets segments, which benefitted from strong revenues in trading, underwriting and advisory services.

With regards to the U.S., the result of the presidential election surprised many. Initial post-election bitterness was quickly replaced by optimism that helped drive equity markets to a solid finish in 2016.

Central banks and monetary policy continued to be a popular topic in North America and across global markets. Towards the end of period, the U.S. Federal Reserve increased interest rates by 25 basis points, while the Bank of Canada announced its decision to maintain its overnight interest rate at 0.50% because of continued economic risks.

Effective February 5, 2016, all Series E and EF shares were converted to Series A shares, under the Front End Sales Charge option, and Series F shares, respectively, of the same Fund. Please refer to the Fund’s simplified prospectus for more details about the captioned change and for details about the Private Client Program.

Related Party Transactions

Sun Life Global Investments (Canada) Inc. (the “Manager”) is the manager and portfolio manager of the Fund.

The Manager is responsible for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day-to-day operations, including providing or arranging for the provision of investment advice, bookkeeping, recordkeeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

For its services, the Manager receives a management fee that is calculated as a percentage of the average net asset value of the Fund. This fee is calculated daily and payable monthly.

As portfolio manager, the Manager is responsible for managing the investment portfolio of the Fund directly or through sub-advisors.

The Manager is an indirect wholly owned subsidiary of Sun Life Financial Inc.

Fund Administrative Expenses

The Manager pays certain of the operating expenses of each Fund (the “Administration Expenses”) in return for a fixed

administration fee paid to the Manager by each Fund (“Administration Fee”). The Administration Fee is based on the net asset value of each series of the Fund. The Administration Expenses include, but are not limited to, record keeper fees, accounting, audit and legal fees, bank and interest charges, safekeeping and custodial fees, taxes, administrative and systems costs, costs of reports to investors, prospectuses and other disclosure documents, regulatory filing fees (including those incurred by the Manager) and trustee fees for registered plans. The amount of this charge is disclosed as a fund administrative expense in the Fund’s Statement of Comprehensive Income found in the annual financial statements (audited).

Each Fund also pays certain operating expenses directly (the “Fund Costs”). Fund Costs include: borrowing costs incurred by the Fund from time to time; costs in connection with portfolio transactions; fees and expenses payable to or in connection with the Fund’s Independent Review Committee (“IRC”); taxes payable by the Fund; and the costs of complying with any new regulatory or legal requirement imposed on the Fund. Each Fund allocates Fund Costs proportionately among its series of shares. The Fund Costs that are specific to a series of shares are allocated to that series. These amounts are paid out of the assets attributed to each series of shares of the Fund, which reduces the return you may receive.

Series Description

The Fund offers the following series of shares: A, AT5, F, I and O. The date of creation for Series A, AT5 and F shares was August 1, 2013, the date of creation for Series O shares was April 1, 2014, and the date of creation for Series I shares was May 1, 2015.

Series A and AT5 shares are available to all investors.

Series AT5 shares are designed to provide investors with a fixed monthly distribution based upon a target annualized distribution rate of 5% of the net asset value per share as at the end of the prior year.

Series F shares are available to investors who have a fee-based account with their dealer and whose dealer has signed an agreement with the Manager. Instead of paying sales charges, investors buying Series F shares pay fees to their dealer for investment advice and other services. The Manager does not pay any commissions to dealers in respect of Series F shares, so the Manager can charge a lower management fee.

Series I shares are special purpose securities that are currently only available to other mutual funds and eligible institutional investors. Series I shares are not sold to the general public. Each Series I investor negotiates its own management and advisory fee that is paid directly to the Manager.

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Series O shares are available to investors through the Private Client program and must be purchased through a Private Client account. Each Series O investor pays a management fee directly to the Manager and is eligible for management fee reductions, if any, based on the value of Series O shares held in the investor's Private Client account. Series O management fee is paid, after subtracting any management fee reductions, by a redemption of Series O shares in the investor's account.

Management Fees

The annual maximum management fee paid by the Fund is a percentage of the average daily net asset value of each series exclusive of any applicable taxes and operating expenses, which is accrued daily and is paid to the Manager monthly in arrears. Management fees pay for portfolio and investment advisory services, oversight of any service providers, marketing and promotional activities, arranging for the distribution and sale of securities of the Fund, general administration of fund operations and sales and trailing commissions paid to dealers.

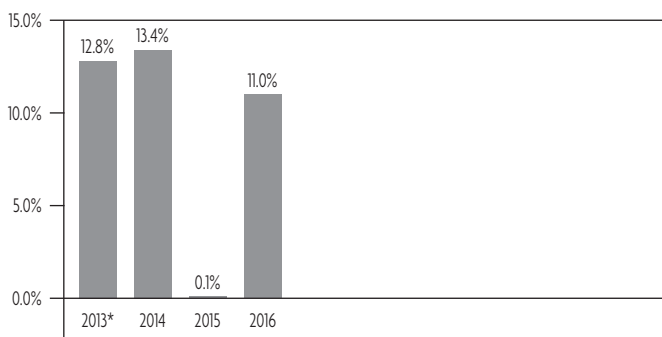
PAST PERFORMANCE

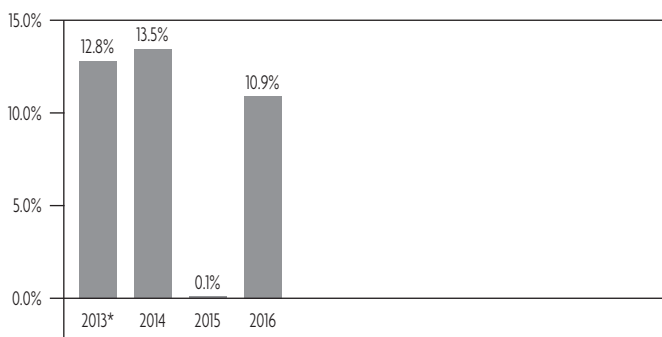
Year-by-Year Returns

Series A Shares – Annual return for the period ended December 31, 2016

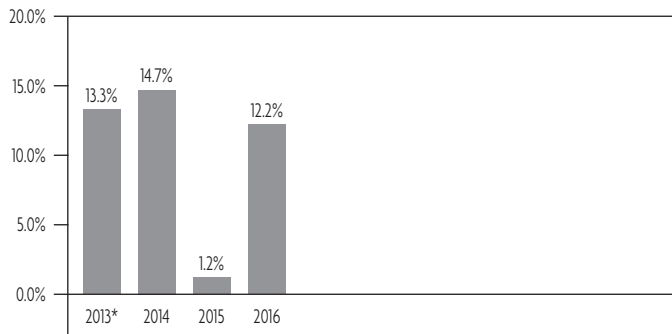


Series AT5 Shares – Annual return for the period ended December 31, 2016



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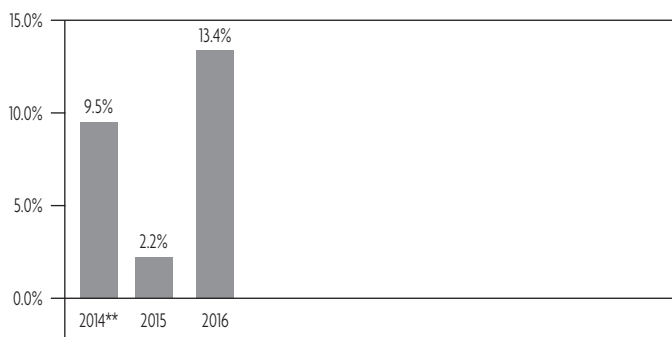
Series F Shares – Annual return for the period ended December 31, 2016

Annual Compound Returns

The S&P/TSX Composite Index covers approximately 95% of the Canadian equities market, and has been the primary gauge for Canadian-based, Toronto Stock Exchange-listed companies since 1977.

The Series A shares underperformed the benchmark since inception, but outperformed the benchmark over the past year.
